Presenter Biographies

Damien Keane was educated at Vassar College, Queen's University, Belfast, and the University of Pennsylvania and is currently Assistant Professor of English at the University of Buffalo. His particular field of interest is twentieth-century Irish writing.

Mark Shechner is a Professor of English at the University of Buffalo. He received Bachelor's and Master's degrees from UCLA and a Doctorate from the University of California at Berkeley. He has published many essays and journal articles and is also known locally for more than 200 book reviews and travel articles published by The Buffalo News since he became a contributing writer in 1983. His literary commentary also appears in The Chicago Tribune and The Jerusalem Post.

Laurence Shine is a Professor of Anglo-Irish Literature at Buffalo State College. He was narrator and co-writer of the documentary film "Following James Joyce: Dublin to Buffalo", directed by Patrick Martin. He is also co-founder and host of Bloomsday Buffalo and founder of the Ulysses Reading Circle.

Patrick Martin is a partner in the firm of Kennedy, Stoeckl and Martin, legal counsel of the Buffalo and Erie County Public Library, and a literary agent of the Mark Twain Foundation, NY City and the Bancroft Library, University of California, Berkeley. He is President of riverrun, Director of Cinegae Buffalo, and producer and director of films on Nelson Mandela and James Joyce.
